Why I Am AGO-Certified

The AGO Colleague certificate is a worthwhile endeavor in my opinion, for no other reason than that it will sharpen your Sunday morning skills. The primary benefit for me was improved hymn playing; mine had gotten perfunctory ten years out of college. A screen was set up between the organ console and the examiners so that anonymity was maintained, important if one is self-conscious.

The Associate certificate was on a higher plane, half of the exam done at the organ and the written half [approx 3 hours] on a separate day. I would say the required pieces were at the graduate school level and

I was fortunate to have **John Courter's** guidance in preparation. After the required pieces came transposing a chorale at sight, realization of figured bass, and sight reading on three staves. The exam would have been easier if I had taken it during or after college when one's knowledge of counterpoint, fugal writing, music history and ear training are fresher.

Mass in B-minor at Cathedral of Christ the King

On Friday, March 31, at 8:00 p.m., the UK Chorale (our top mixed choir) and the Kentucky Bach Choir are joining forces to present J. S. Bach's monumental Mass in B-minor at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Lexington! This is one of the most beloved, yet difficult, works in the choral repertoire, rarely heard because of its demands and challenges. Because of its incredible architecture, technical polish, and consistent quality, the Mass in B-minor has been called "One of the supreme achievements of classical music."

This is the first-ever collaboration of the UK Chorale and the Kentucky Bach Choir. **Marlon Hurst** and I are preparing our choirs independently and will join forces on the week of March 27. We will have a full baroque orchestra of 22 players playing, in some cases, period instruments.

2017 is the 500th anniversary of the German Reformation, a fact that puts Lutherans like Bach in a timely spotlight, so it is the perfect year for this masterpiece.

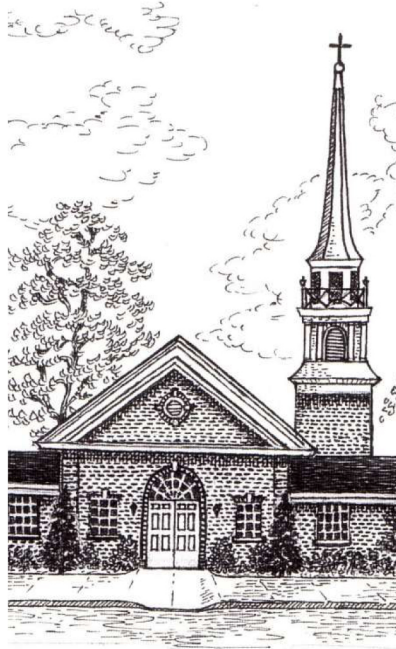
